

Policy Recommendations:

Indoor Air Pollution



Women in Europe for a Common Future

- <u>Provide reliable information</u> about the negative health impacts of indoor pollution and about the solutions to it
- <u>Include civil society in your policy process</u> and develop intersectoral partnerships: business, government, administration and NGOs
- <u>Set insulation standards for houses</u> and develop financial support programs to reach these standards especially for people with low income
- <u>Set energy efficiency standards for appliances</u>, promote them and develop financial support programs for people with low income
- <u>Develop programs</u> to promote and support energy saving and efficiency measures as well as renewable energy
- Give priority to the production of renewable energy in different ways:
 - give incentives and loans to people who want to produce their own renewable energy
 - o set up a programme for fostering renewable energy sources
 - invest in research, technology transfer and development of alternative energy sources
- Give tax incentives for businesses who deal with sustainable energy or want to start a business with sustainable energy
- <u>Support decentralized local activities</u> for a sustainable development of the region with sustainable energy as a key element
