Post-2015, what is the future we want?

Dutch input for Human Rights/Gender/SRGR and Sustainable Development

In 2015 the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) will end. Currently, the debate about the new framework for global development after 2015 is at full blast. The United Nations have a **Post-2015 High-Level** expert panel and are collecting input from civil society through online discussions and country – and theme consultations. Governments are negotiating with each other about the formation of the **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)**. Meanwhile, there are lessons learned from Rio+20; a review is taking place of the ICPD Programme of Action leading up to the UNGASS on ICPD (2014); and in 2015 it is 20 years after the Beijing Platform for Action was accepted.

The networks **WO=MEN Dutch Gender Platform**, **Share-Net** and **Rio+20 Women's Mayor Group** representing the Women in Europe for a Common Future (WECF), are joining hands to initiate a dialogue with the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs to ensure that Gender, Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR), Human Rights and Sustainable Development are included in the new framework for global development.

Therefore, the 3 networks will facilitate a consultation meeting on 11 December for organisations and individuals from civil society that are interested in or actively involved in ensuring that human rights/gender/SRHR are included on the post 2015 agenda.

During this consultation we will work on a common agenda and recommendations for the Dutch Government regarding content and process (the "road to the post 2015 agenda").
