



Waste


- 2–6% of the population are affected by waste-related exposures
- Air emissions of CO2 and air pollutants have measurable health impacts, costing between €4–63 per ton of disposed waste
- Legacy of Industrial contamination in EEA alone: at least 2.5m contaminated sites of which up to 350,000 in need of remediation



Programme area: Health and Environment (cont.)


- Needs Assessment and training of experts from health and environment on environment and health indicators completed.
- The Advocacy poster on clean air is prepared, printed and distributed.
- WHO facilitated and provided support to the intersectorial working group, under the coordination of MoH, for the preparation of the National Guideline on Water Safety Plans (WSPs) in Small Scale Water Supply Systems (SSWSS) in Albania and the Roadmap for its implementation.



CATEGORY 5. PREPAREDNESS, SURVEILLANCE AND RESPONSE



 Albania underwent an independent external evaluation for the Implementation of IHR. The external evaluation took place from 5-9 September 2016. The Evaluation Report was shared with Albanian authorities within 2016.
